


## EBSCO

EBSCO is an online information resource. Through EBSCO, St Patrick's has a subscription to six online full-text databases. The databases offer access to full text articles from many of the most prestigious, peer-reviewed journals for Business, Religion and Education.

There are two databases for Business – Business Source Premier and Regional Business News. Business Source Premier is the industry's most used business resource database with full text for more than 2,300 journals. The databases for Religion are Religion and Philosophy Collection and ATLA Religion database with ATLASerials. ATLA Religion database with ATLASerials provides access to more than 294,000 full-text articles and book reviews. Education Research Complete and ERIC are the two databases for Education.

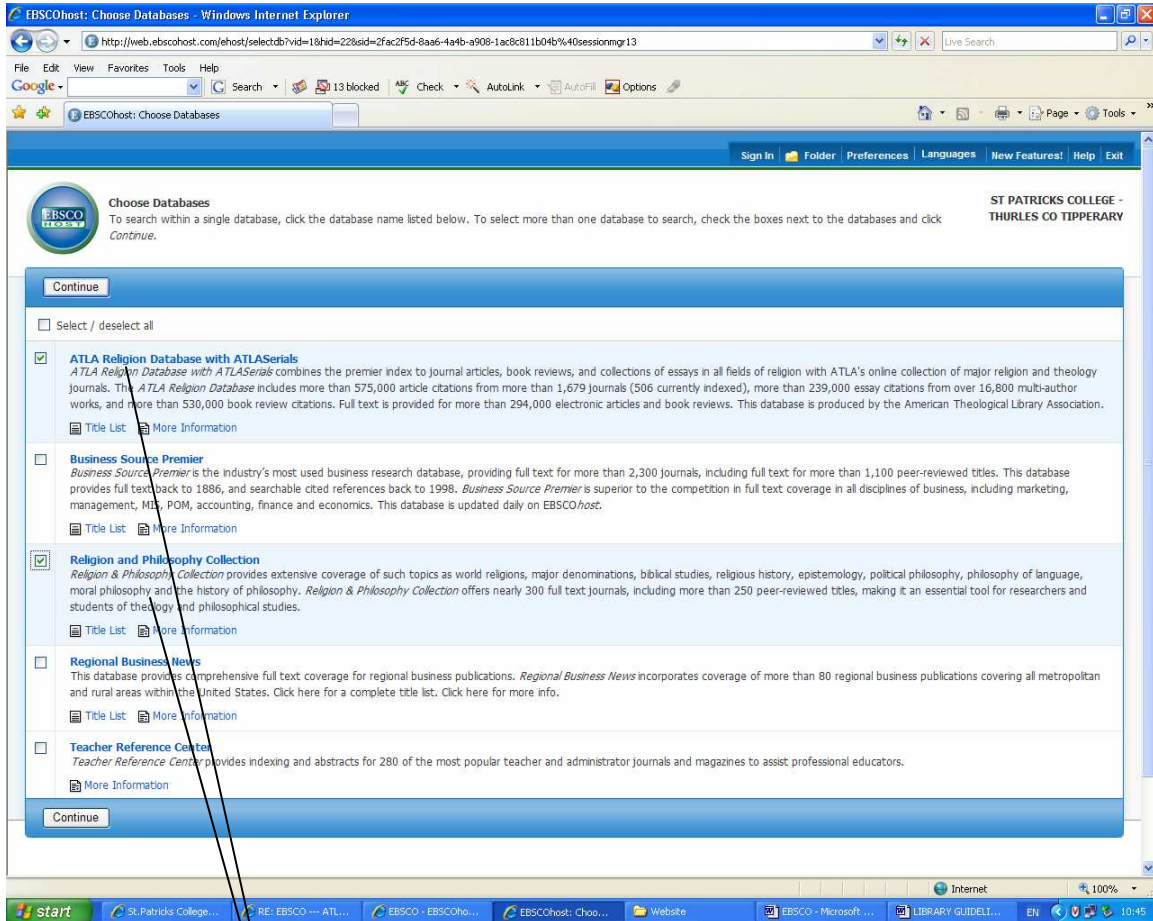
To access EBSCO go to the Student Resources section of the college website [www.stpats.ie](http://www.stpats.ie). Click on the 'Link to EBSCO database' and enter the user ID and password.

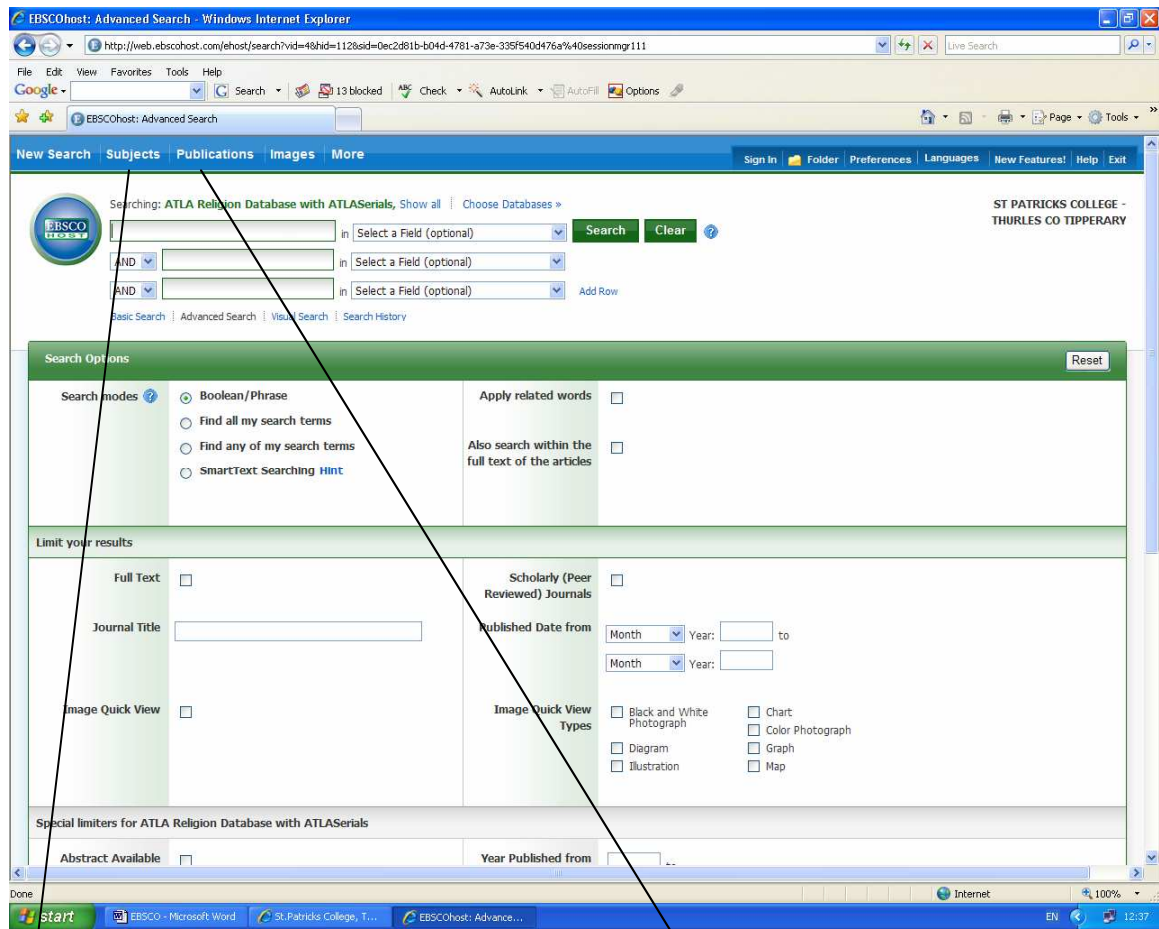

There are various ways to search from here.

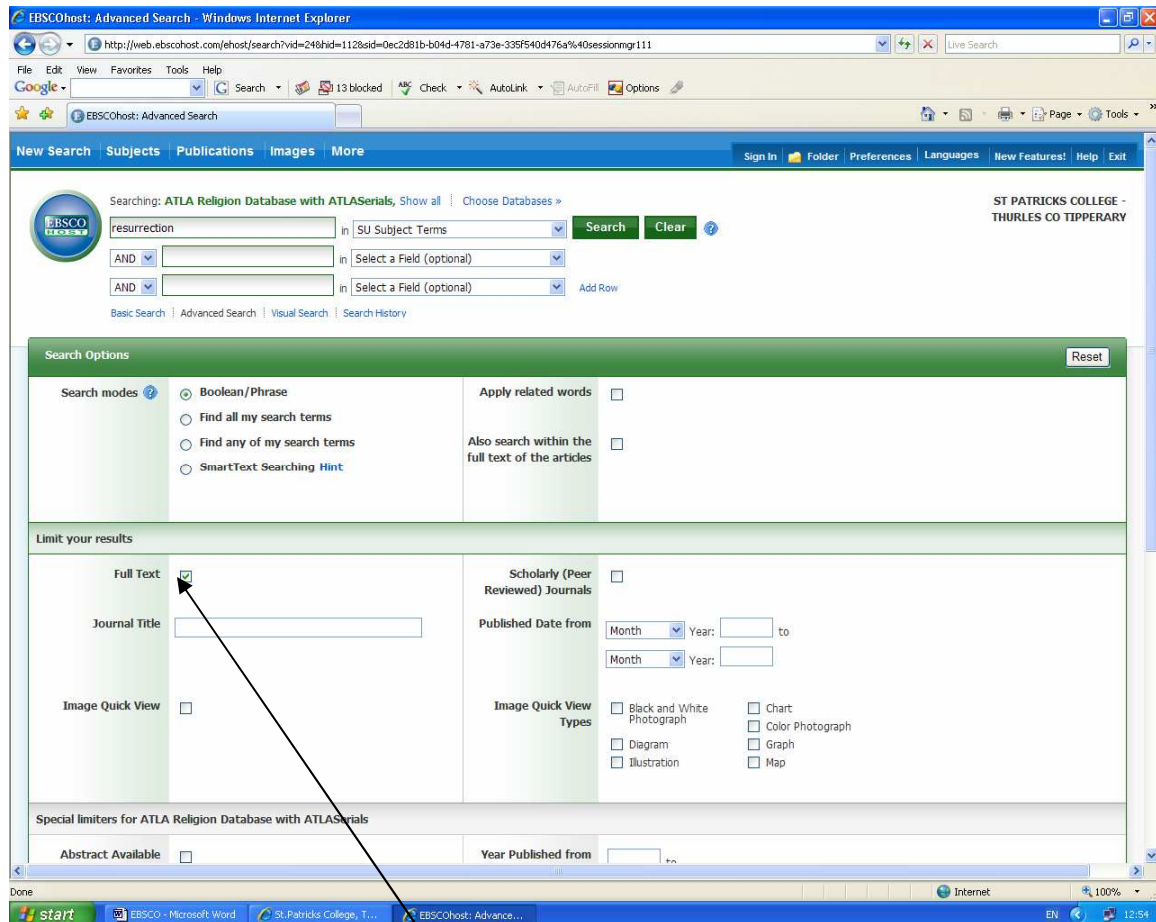


You can click on Publications and search for a particular journal, for example, The Journal of Religion. Then you can search this particular journal.

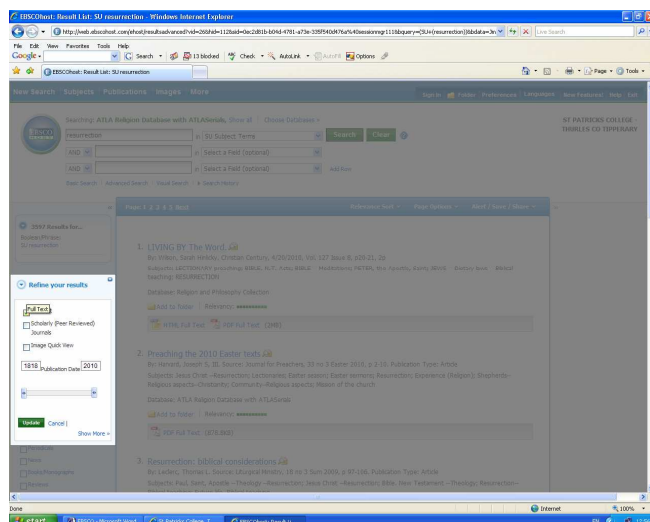
You can click on Subjects and enter the topic that you're researching, for example, resurrection.

Or you can simply enter terms relating to your topic in the search fields at the top of the screen, for example, resurrection in the left-hand search field and pick SU Subject terms in the field on the right.

# TIPS



1. Remember to tick the Full Text box. By doing so, only the results with full-text articles will be displayed. If you forget to tick the box here you can also tick it in the 'Refine your search' section.



## 2. **Always** write down the reference for an article that you read.

3. When you find an article that is relevant to your research, you can either save it or print it.
